

PIEDAD CASTAÑO: From Colombia, Piedad has participated with various Hispanic groups in New York as an actress. In 2011 she won an award for her performance of the monologue of "La Luna" from Lorca's play "Blood Wedding", directed by Teodoris Castellanos (q.ep.d.), in the Monologando Ando theatrical festival. Piedad also won an award for her participation in TEBA's festival for her performance in Cama para tres (A Bed for Three), directed by Cecill Villar. Piedad performed various poems

and monologues in *Danisarte's* Lorca festivals. During the Requiem for Lorca theatrical festival, Piedad performed with Jonathan Reed-Wexler in the bilingual adaptation of Lorca's La Luna monologue in a dramatic dance theatre piece, directed by Alicia Kaplan. For her participation in "Soliluna" during 2021, Piedad was the recipient of ATI and Talia Awards. She is delighted to reprise her role in "Soliluna" during this tour, under the direction of Alicia Kaplan. So "fasten your imaginary seatbelts, and here we go!"



INMA HEREDIA: A native of Seville, Spain and the world's first and only Flamenco comedienne, Inma is noted for her "salero" and performs as an actress, master of ceremonies, singer, dancer, comedian and host. With Danisarte she has performed extensively in plays of different genres and all of Danisarte's Lorca festivals. Inma created the role of Lili, the multinational narrator, actress, and puppet in Alicia Kaplan's bilingual interactive play "Soliluna: a magical voyage thru five continents".



LEANDRO COMRIE-PEPIN: Began his passion for art at an early age. Born in Brooklyn, New York of Panamanian and Venezuelan descent, his dedication to art was nurtured in Caracas, Venezuela, where he grew up. In the core of his work lays a profound concern for social, cultural and intellectual matters. He has depicted the plight of single mothers, social unrest, homophobia, loneliness, sexuality, and identity. He has exhibited in the United States, Germany, Austria and Hungary.



LUIS GALLI: From Peru, and of Italian descent, Luis is an actor, lawyer, professor, and a novelist. He has many film credits, including in the Peruvian film "La Novia del Libertador" and the Peruvian series "Fray Martin of Torres". Before acting, Luis worked as a lawyer for UNO in Geneva, Switzerland. His latest novel "Mujer Desaparecida" is an international bestseller. He created the role of Benjamin for the premiere of "Soliluna: a magical voyage thru five continents" in New York City.



VALERIA AVINA: From Durango, Mexico, Valeria holds a MFA in Acting from the University of Iowa. She also is a graduate of the Fitzmaurice Teacher Training, and has taught voice at Rutgers and Fordham Universities. Valeria is the Associate Producer of Dias Entertainment and the Co-Founder at Claro Wey WebSeries. She has participated in theatrical productions, commercials, and films in the U.S.A., as well as in her native Mexico.



PREMIER SOLIS: From Puerto Rico, Premier studied at the University of Puerto Rico and the Queens College Department in New York. Premier is a former columnist of the newspaper La Voz Hispana de Nueva York and also performed with many Hispanic groups in New York City. With *Danisarte* he portrayed Fidel Castro in Un Encuentro Fugaz by Sonia Suarez Schwartz, directed by Alicia Kaplan, and in A Nuyorican Tale, by and directed by Anita Velez-Mitchell.

JULIO ORTEGA: Born in Guayaqui, Ecuador. Graduated at The American Academy of Dramatic Arts of New York. He has worked in theater, film and TV. Among the most prominent NY theater companies which Julio worked for, the most significant are Teatro SEA, Repertorio Español, Danisarte, Kayros Theater Group y Fragal.

In film he has worked as the leading role in "Medardo" the film - also he was the General Producer and Scriptwriter - "American Quartet" and

"Wet Shapes". In TV shows he has worked for "De la vida real" by Ecuavisa, "The Perfect Murder", "A Crime to Remember", "The Hunt" and "El puente del destino".

Along his career he has received awards and recognitions as an actor, producer and scriptwriter, such as Borimix of New York (2019), Guayaquil LAB (2019), El Cinefilia in Medellín, Colombia (2018), Consulado Ecuatoriano of New York (2017), MICSUR of Bogotá, Colombia (2016), Premios HOLA of New York (2016), "La Palma de Oro" of México, "La Iguana Dorada" of Guayaquil, Ecuador (2015), Premios ACE of New York (2012), Premios ATI of New York (2012). Ortega is member of The Actors Society, HOLA (Hispanic Organization of Latin Actors) and TAPNYC.



ELAINE MENDEZ: Of Cuban and Puerto Rican descent, New York-based and self-taught artist Elaine operated two art spaces, NYC Arts Empire and E&M Productions located in the neighborhood of Soho, N.Y. She is one of the founders of Labyrinth Arts Collective, Inc. a 501 © 3 non for profit arts organization based in Staten Island N.Y. To date, Elaine has participated in more than 80 group and solo shows. Inspired by multiple experimentation and fellow mentoring, she continues to be a "lifelong

MICHAEL ANTON: (Photographer): A respected and veteran photographer who has worked with Danisarte since its inception, Michael is presently the Director of Photography and Public Relations of the New York City Department of Sanitation.

SEBASTIAN GIL LÓPEZ: (Videographer): From Guatemala, Sebastian is also a freelance photographer, working steadily with Thalia Spanish Theatre in Queens.



JUAN GUZMAN: From Mexico, Juan is a producer, playwright, author, actor, & clown (Payaso Boliche). He is a graduate of the Colegio de Arte Dramático de la Escuela de Artes de la Universidad Autónoma de Puebla, Juan is the Founder and Director of Teatro LETAR. He has performed extensively throughout New York and New Jersey with different entities. He has written and edited three books. He has a long association with Danisarte, appearing in almost every bilingual theatrical festival of Los

Nuevos Valores/the New Treasures in el Barrio as an actor/director/playwright. Juan is a veteran of four Lorca festivals produced by Danisarte.



MIGUEL MALO: From Ecuador, Miguel has worked as a Field and Studio Producer at BRONXNET and BRIC. He studied theatre at the Julia de Burgos Cultural Center and at the Comisionado Dominicano de Cultura in New York. As an actor, he participated in La Mamá Tingo Christmas play, directed by José Bonilla and in La Pasión de Cristo in 2022 and 2023 produced and directed by Juan Guzmán. He also participated in La Pastorela in 2022, also produced and directed by Juan Guzmán.



MARIPOSA: From Puerto Rico, Mariposa studied acting at La Academia Arte y Comunicación Celinés Toribio with Fior Marte, the Comisionado Dominicano de Cultura with Luis Felipe Rodriguez, la Casa de la Cultura Navarrete U.S. with José Bonilla, Teatro Intinerante de Venezuela with Dimas González, and others. Mariposa is grateful for the opportunity to work with this marvelous cast in this exemplary production and the opportunity to further her knowledge of all aspects of acting, technical

He has worked as a volunteer for both immigrant and homeless organizations.

PRODUCERS



HERNAN ACUÑA (Associate Producer & Technical Director): From Colombia, Hernan studied Theatre Arts at La Universidad Tecnológica in Pereira, and performed with the theatrical group "Los Juglares" in many productions. In New York, he studied at the Center for Media Arts and also worked as an actor and as a technician throughout New York. His history with Danisarte began as a lighting technician and then as the Technical Director in numerous bilingual theatrical festivals at the Julia

de Burgos Latino Cultural Center in East Harlem. He worked with Danisarte at the Tenement Theatre at the Lower East Side Tenement Museum with "Herencia de amor y sangre" (by Arnaldo Rodriguez), which was the first production in Spanish at that theatre. In 2014 he served as the Technical Director and Narrator of "El Manicomio" (by Myrna Lluch), both directed by Alicia Kaplan, presented in collaboration with el Taller Boricua at the Julia de Burgos Latino Cultural Center. He was also the Associate Producer and Technical Director for Danisarte's previous Lorca Festivals and spearheaded the Colombian tour of "Soliluna: a magical journey thru 5 continents."



ALICIA KAPLAN: (Producing Artistic Director & Founder of Danisarte, Stage Director, Choreographer, Bilingual Actress): Danisarte, now in its 31st year, a not-for-profit bilingual theatrical production company whose mission is to develop original productions in English and Spanish with the goal of increasing understanding among people of many cultures and nations, develop, and showcase the talents of minority artists. Danisarte (www.Danisarte.org) has offered bilingual acting and

playwriting workshops, an annual theatrical festival in East Harlem and served as an incubator for novice artists and an experimental platform and springboard for both novices and professionals. Alicia has developed and directed 58 plays for Danisarte and many other theatrical companies and institutions.

As a child, Alicia studied ballet and performed in many productions on television and at el Teatro Nacional and Municipal in Caracas Venezuela. Later she studied diplomacy, languages, dance and acting in New York under the tutelage of Maria Swoboda, Merce Cunningham, Luigi, Uta Hagen, as well as with Sonia Moore and the Center for Stanislavski Art. A veteran of more than 260 productions including television series, films, theatre, commercials, and broadcasting.

Alicia has performed in the United States, Venezuela, Puerto Rico, Mexico, Colombia, and Spain. She is the Host of the web series Welcome to My World/Bienvenidos a mi Mundo with/con Alicia.

AWARDS: The Association of Latin Critics of New York (A.C.E.), The Hispanic Organization of Latin Artists, Aplausos, Palmas de Oro, the Latin American Theatre Ensemble, The Screen Actors' Guild's Joseph C. Riley Service Award for her work with the Equal Ethnic Opportunities Committee, and the Medaille D'Argent from the Société Académique D'Éducation et D'Encouragement from France in recognition of her contributions to the acting profession. From Mexico, an Award from the Ayuntamiento Constitucional y el Instituto de Protección de la Infancia. In Cabo Rojo, Puerto Rico, Alicia was bestowed an Honor Distinction. In New York, the "Gabriela Mistral, Frida Kahlo, Julia de Burgos Reconocimiento" from the Galo Plaza International Committee, a Latin American Theatre Award, and the "Premio Concepción Arenal Aponte" from the Latin American Cultural Center of Queens, New York. From Spain, for Artistic Excellence, a Special Recognition Award from el Ayuntamiento de Churriana de la Vega.

Alicia was awarded in 2018 Golden ACE Award for her artistic and cultural legacy as the Producing Artistic Director of *Danisarte*. Alicia presented two Lorca festivals: Celebrating Lorca & Requiem for Lorca at La Nacional in New York City in 2019, and in 2020 the Premiere of the first virtual online bilingual theatrical festival: *Lorca Lives/Lorca Vive*. In June 2021 *Danisarte* became one of the first companies to present a live theatrical festival Lorca Forever/Lorca por siempre, featuring a vast array of international artists. And in 2023, A Latin Alternative Theatre Award.
